


- 57+ MILLION SF TOTAL = 51% TOTAL PARTICIPATION

- 20.3 MILLION SF IN UNIVERSITY CIRCLE = 72% PARTICIPATION







Collectively, participating buildings (no odd space types) are performing at 20% below baseline, saving the equivalent of the energy use of 5613 homes.



¹Includes C2030D participating properties with water data in Portfolio Manager

Collectively, participating properties are performing 18% below baseline, saving 97.5 million gallons of water.



Collectively, buildings that participated in the most recent 2016 transportation survey are performing 15% below baseline, saving the equivalent of 484 cars' annual CO2 emissions.
